Exhibits may be entered in one class only.

Cut flowers must be grown by exhibitor in open garden conditions except classes 49,50 & 51.

All flowers, except pansies, to be exhibited with stem attached. Pansies may be shown with collars.

Rosebuds must show colour of rose, with one petal turned back.

Orchids and Camellias to be shown in their own classes only.

Three distinct means three different coloured species.

Please consult a steward before leaving your entries to ensure they are in the correct class.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS:

Wildflowers may only be collected from private property with the owner's permission. Picking of wildflowers from roadsides and reserves is prohibited by law.
