All grain and fodder must have been grown by the farmer or family during the current season, and will be judged on, weight 15 points; protein 20 points; screenings 15 points; freedom from disease 10 points; type, appearance and uniformity 10 points; freedom from foreign matter 10 points; freedom from harvest injury 10 points; freedom from weeds 10 points; total 100 points. All varieties must be named. No chemically treated grain accepted. Fodder must have roots attached, preferably washed, minimum 6 plants or 3kg.

Trophies and prizes will be presented at a designated time at Fodder and Grain section. Please see the Show day program.

### Fodder and Grain

- 1 Hard wheat (4 litre ice-cream container size)
- 2 A.S.W. or A.P.W.
- 3 Malting barley
- 4 Feed barley
- 5 Milling oats
- 6 Feed oats
- 7 Canola (1 kg only)
- 8 Peas, lentils, chickpeas
- 9 Beans
- 10 Lupins

**Classes 11-25 - Must have washed roots included - Min 3 kg bundle**

- 11 Bundle of green lupins
- 12 Bundle of green peas
- 13 Bundle of green beans
- 14 Bundle of green wheat
- 15 Bundle of green barley
- 16 Bundle of green lentils or chickpeas
- 17 Bundle of green oats for grain
- 18 Bundle of green oats for hay
- 19 Bundle of green canola for grain
- 20 Bundle of clover or medic, no roots
- 21 Bundle of lucerne (not in flower), no roots
- 22 Bundle of green feed, non legume, no roots
- 23 Bundle of green feed, legume, no roots

- 24 Sod of clover or medic pasture with less than 15 cms growth, grazed, to be judged for feed value and development
- 25 Sod of mixed pasture with less than 15 cms growth, grazed, to be judged for feed value and development
- 26 Collection of six or more bundles of green fodder and grain varieties (no roots) preferably arranged for display

**Classes 27-30 - Must have washed roots included-Min 3 kg bundle**

- 27 Irrigated canola
- 28 Irrigated wheat
- 29 Irrigated barley
- 30 Irrigated other crop
- 31 Special Class: Most spectacular weed
