ENTRIES – closing date for entries: Livestock, Poultry and Pigeons, Friday, September 28th at 6pm; **all other entries close on Thursday, October 4th at 6pm.**

EXHIBITS – Wool, Art, Craft, Junior Art and Photography exhibits must be in the Show office by 6pm Thursday, before Show day and all other entries by 9am on Show day.

The Elders Pavilion is open to receive exhibits on Friday, October 5th, from 1 pm to 7 pm and from 7.30 am to no later than 9 am on the morning of the Show.

All exhibits are to be in the hands of the Stewards by 9 am on Show day.

REGULATIONS

1. MEMBERSHIP – Life Membership entitles the holder to life membership, and free entry for life in all sections. A \$40 Family Membership entitles the holder to admission to the annual show on Saturday only for 2 adults, and their children, and full membership privileges.
2. ADMISSION – Admission to the grounds shall be: Members: free on production of ticket; Non-members: Adults \$15, School Children \$5, Family \$40. Wristbands will be issued to every person entering the Showgrounds. Please ensure you receive your wristbands. These will act as pass outs.
3. ENTRIES – closing date for entries: Livestock, Poultry and Pigeons, Friday, September 28th at 6pm; all other entries close on Thursday, October 4th at 6pm. ENTRIES BY POST AND EMAIL ARE ENCOURAGED. Entry stickers may be picked up at the Show office. Secretary's address, PO Box 343, Keith 5267. **Phone 0438 578 402 (see Show office hours - page 2).**
4. EXHIBITS –Wool, Art, Craft, Junior Art and Photography exhibits must be in the Show office by 6pm Thursday, before Show day and all other entries by 9am on Show day. NO EXHIBIT TO BE REMOVED BEFORE 5pm on Show day.
5. ENTRY FEES – No entry fees for indoor sections.
6. ENTRIES for exhibits in all classes are received by the Society only on the express condition that exhibitors agree to abide by the decisions of the Judges, Stewards or Committee, and that the decisions and awards made and given are final and not subject to any action at law.
7. SECTION CLASS STICKERS – All exhibits must have attached the proper section class sticker. These stickers are distributed along with your list of entries in each section of the Show. The sticker is to be placed on your exhibit and the list of entries is your proof of ownership when collecting your exhibits at the end of the day. FREE ENTRIES MUST HAVE ENTRY STICKERS ATTACHED.
8. No exhibit will be accepted if it has previously won a first prize in a Keith Show; the only exception being livestock.
9. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property and/or workmanship of the exhibitor, except in the case of horses-in-action and flowers for artistic arrangement.
10. THE JUDGES DECISION SHALL, IN ALL CASES, BE FINAL.
11. The Society will not be responsible under any circumstances whatsoever for any incident, loss, negligence, theft and/or damage howsoever caused on the grounds or premises of the Society, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from or in respect of such accident, loss, negligence, theft or damage.
12. The Judges are empowered to decide upon the age of any animal.
13. No tickets or ribbons previously won to be exhibited prior to or during the judging.

14. This Society is affiliated with the South East of South Australia and Border Show Societies' Association, and any exhibitor or exhibit subject to disqualification by that Association or by any Society affiliated with that Association will be debarred from competition at the Show or this Society during the period of such disqualification or until any appeal that may have been lodged against such disqualification shall have been determined.
15. (a). All protests must be lodged in writing with the Secretary within 60 minutes of the award being made. All protests to be accompanied by a deposit of \$50, to be forfeited to the Society if protest not upheld.
(b). In the event of a dispute being over ownership of an exhibit the exhibit shall become the property of the Society who shall have the right to dispose of the said exhibit at their discretion if the dispute cannot be resolved.
16. All prize money to be collected on show day.
17. The Elders Pavilion must be cleared of all persons except Judges, Conveners and Stewards by 9am. It will re-open approximately 12 noon.
18. DUPLICATION OF ENTRIES – Except in Livestock sections, no exhibit shall be entered in more than one class.
19. Only stock attendants and Judges will be permitted in the rings while judging is in progress.
20. EXHIBITS FOR DISPLAY ONLY – The public are invited to add to the attraction of our show by exhibiting anything rare or choice without fee. Fourteen days' notice of intention to exhibit and space required is necessary.
21. COLLECTION – No collection for any purpose whatsoever may be made without permission by the Executive Committee.
22. TROPHY POINTS – Five points are awarded every first prize, three points are awarded every second prize, one for third prize; tie for first 4 points each; tie for second, two points each.
23. TIES – In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on a count-back.
24. The Society reserves the right to postpone the date of the Show or to abandon the Show should it be deemed advisable to do without incurring any liability by so postponing or abandoning.
25. Prize money will not be paid to any indoor exhibit which receives a trophy.
26. The contents of this book have been carefully compiled and are believed to be correct, but the Society will not be responsible in any way for any inaccuracies which may occur herein.

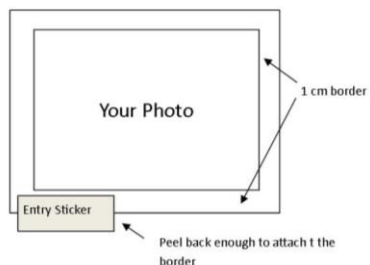
